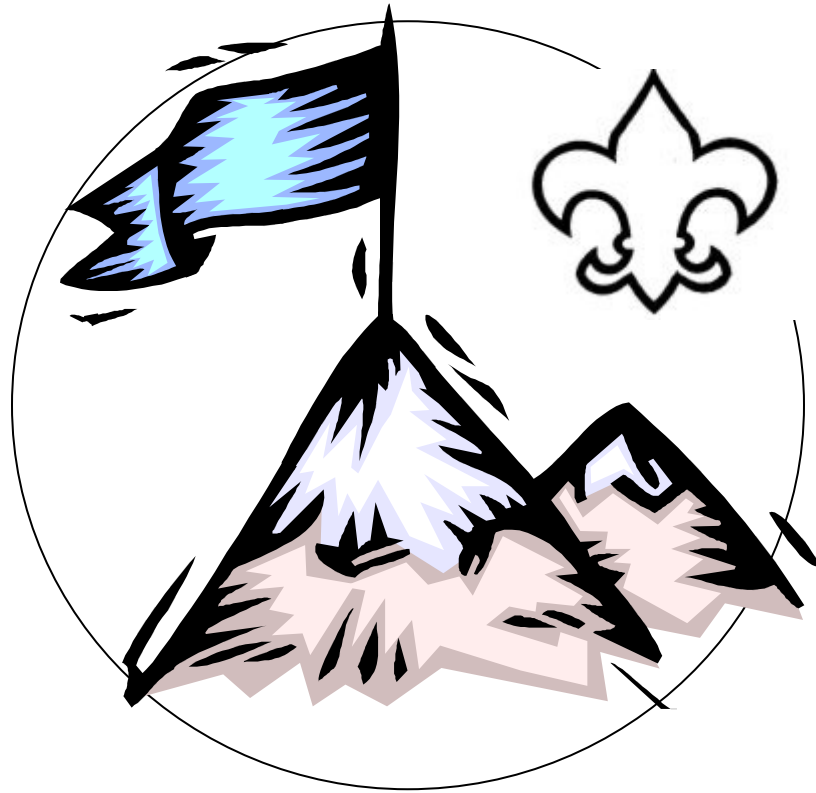

Boy Scout Common Ingredient Cooking Event Rules

1. In order to qualify to participate in the Camporee cooking event, the Troop must submit the proposed menu to Camp Headquarters by 2:00, Saturday afternoon. The complete menu packet will include: the menu; recipes with itemized ingredients; a price list and cost per portion; preparation and cooking methods of the meal; and duty roster. A similar menu and duty roster should be posted for inspection at the campsite.
2. The well-balanced meal should include a main dish, fruit or vegetable, bread or cereal, beverage, and dessert. Menus must include the use of a common ingredient, specified by the Camporee staff. **The Camporee common ingredient may be used in any portion of the meal.** The common ingredient will be announced:
 - At the Camporee during registration; and
 - At the District Roundtable on April 9th; and
 - Posted on the District website on April 1st
3. The judges will be observing all aspects of your meal preparation. He or she may be offered an appetizer, but only if it is listed on the menu and all troop members are provided the same. The judge is your guest; however, he or she should not be offered or receive any food item that is not on the menu. The patrol must provide the judge with a plate, cup, and eating utensils.
4. No contestant may leave the immediate cooking area during the contest. It is important to have all the materials and water you will need to prepare your meal before the competition begins.
5. The meal must be prepared and served within 1 hour and 15 minutes. Washing and general preparation (such as chopping) may be done prior to coming to Camporee. The judges must be served the main meal by 6:15 PM or 25 points will be deducted from your final score on this event.
6. Each team will prepare enough servings for your Troop and the judge, usually 6 to 10 servings. Make sure there is enough food to go around. The lack of food will hurt the final score.
7. The price per individual serving should not exceed \$5.00. The team may pro-rate the cost of ingredients of the meal. For example, if a team purchases a pound of sugar and only $\frac{1}{4}$ of the pound is used, only that portion of the price is used in the per serving calculation.
8. The competition will be scored in the following areas:

• Organization and Planning	10%	• Meal Presentation	10%
• Menu selection and balanced meal	10%	• Safety and Cleanliness	20%
• Cooking method and creativity	10%	• Taste and Quality	20%
• Use of the common ingredient	10%	• Teamwork and Scout Spirit	10%
9. Courtesy, appropriate attire, teamwork, and Scout Spirit are required at all times. All Patrol members must participate as assigned on the duty roster. Any special tools, camp gadgets, unique or creative cooking methods are encouraged.
10. Safety and cleanliness must be practiced throughout the cooking event. Adult Scouters or other Troop members from outside the patrol may assist to correct a safety or hygiene concern. The difficulty of the meal preparation is less important than the overall quality and nutritional value.
11. Cooking fires are only authorized in the freestanding barbeque or a camp stove. No ground fires will be permitted. Patrol boxes and ice chests are permitted. Above all, have fun!

Cub Scout Cooking Event Rules

Scoutish Games Dessert Making Contest

After a long day of competition, what could be better than a delicious meal and a fine dessert.

Make any type of dessert you want to satisfy their cravings. The only catch is each Patrol will be given a common ingredient to work into their recipe that will be unknown to them until shortly before the competition. The common ingredient will be announced:

- At the Camporee during registration; and
- At the District Roundtable on April 9th; and
- Posted on the District website on April 1st.

Webelos Patrols will provide all cooking materials; Camporee staff will provide the Judges and the common ingredient. Bring your prepared dessert to the judges' table between 5:30 and 6:30.

SCORING: Patrols will be judged on creativity, baking skills, presentation, and taste.
